

What is a Comprehensive Community Plan?

A CCP is a strategic plan for our Nation that is developed by our Members and for our Members.

The process of creating a CCP involves bringing the entire Nation together to share ideas for a better future.

What is a CCP?

A CCP is focused on all aspects of Member wellbeing, including health, governance, culture, housing and infrastructure, the economy, lands, people, places and programs. It:

- Highlights our Nation's strengths and opportunities
- Identifies the issues and challenges that our Members face
- Sets out a shared vision and goals for the future
- Establishes actions and strategies for bringing about desired changes
- Helps guide our leadership and staff in their decision making and day-today work
- Opens up funding opportunities



What is a Traditional Territory Stewardship Plan (TTSP)?


A TTSP is a plan that is focused on land use and stewardship on a territory-wide scale.

This plan will help our Nation manage land use issues and look after key values and important places, based on the priorities that Members identify through our planning process.

What is a TTSP?

- Grounded in Ts'il Kaz Koh culture and values
- Establishes a vision and more specific objectives for the management of Ts'il Kaz Koh traditional territory
- Provides clarity on what can be done where within Ts'il Kaz Koh traditional territory (e.g., government, industry)
- Prepares Ts'il Kaz Koh to make decisions that reflect our vision, values, and priorities as a Nation





24 homes on Ts'il Kaz Koh reserve lands.




Our administration office is located within the Village of Burns Lake at the site of the former high school.

We have a small but dedicated staff serving our Membership.




Many of our local health and wellness services are delivered through Carrier Sekani Family Services.

Four reserves totaling **184.6** ha A small fraction of our traditional territory.


Burns Lake IR18 - situated within the boundaries of the Village of Burns Lake

Sheraton Creek IR19 - located southeast of IR#18 on Hwy 16 near the hamlet of Sheraton, BC




